



## **Know Your Chances**

The actual chances of an STI being passed are unique to each infection. Some STIs are more common than others. You are less likely to get an infection that is not very common, even if the infection can be passed that way.

- Sometimes condoms can break or slip. If this happens, the chances of getting an STI are the same if no condom
  was used. Condoms are not as good at preventing infections passed by skin-to-skin contact such as syphilis,
  herpes and HPV.
- Body fluids like blood, semen/cum, vaginal fluid, rectal fluid and breastmilk can pass STIs. This will depend on the
  infection and the type of contact you may have with your sexual partner. Fluids like sweat, tears, saliva and urine
  do not pass STIs.
- People living with HIV can take medication to lower the amount of virus in their blood to a very low level. This is called undetectable viral load, and it means that HIV cannot be passed to others through sexual activities (also called Undetectable = Untransmissible, or U=U).
- Pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) is medication that you can take daily, or as prescribed to lower your chances of getting HIV.

The charts below can give you an idea of which sexual activities are more or less likely to pass an infection to you if your partner has that infection. The table is based on published research and reviewed by STI experts in British Columbia. It does not cover every situation or STI.
